## DOTSERO

The oldest grave found in the Dotsero area is that of Alexander Campbell STEWART, great grandfather to Leland STEWART of Gypsum. He was buried in 1886.

It is north of Dotsero frontage road, east of the old school house. It can be seen from the road going to Joan CLARK's house.

From the west bound ramp to I70 on the right is a small cemetery. Here are four graves. Here is the grave of Jack STEWART, grand father of Leland STEWART. Dates 1842 - 1916. At the foot of this headstone is a marker for the ashes of Jack STEWART the second, dates 1923 - 1979.

The baby of Edna Stewart LEMON is buried here.

The other headstone is that of Elsie Trump OWENS. She was the daughter of Nelson YOST, an early settler in Dotsero. she was the mother of Gene Trump who lives on Sweetwater.

The graves are in good shape and are kept up by the families.
